
Proposed Development

TENURE PLAN (NTS)

The current proving layout provides 186 homes with a mixture of Shared ownership & affordable dwellings.

RED = 20% Affordable Total 37 dwellings


BLUE = 80% Shared Ownership Total 149 dwellings Proposed Mix of housing – all affordable, mostly shared ownership, all to be owned and managed by Hyde

Points of consideration











Possible Positive Outcomes

- > Availability of affordable rented housing in Hunston
- Opportunity for local people to get onto the housing ladder by means of Shared Ownership properties
- Potentially more custom for the shops and pub to keep them viable
- ➤ More friends and neighbours! Likely more families with children using play facilities.
- ➤ Possible investment into village facilities if we know what to negotiate for and what's realistic. The developers are prepared to make commitment to get our support (but to a point).

Known concerns

- Increased volume of traffic through the village.
- the increase in air pollution.
- the potential for additional flooding through the village.
- the potential for sewage discharge within the village or harbours.
- the current lack of available school places within reasonable walking distance.
- the availability of doctors or dentists to cope with additional residents.
- * the availability of properties for truly local people.

Routes Forward

We could support if:

- The developers offered more to the wider village but what?
- If there were fewer houses but there will be threshold that it wont be viable for them to go below and the fewer houses the less they will be able to offer us.

We could oppose:

- We might win and get no houses as in the new draft plan
- They might appeal and we might loose our leverage to negotiate.
